

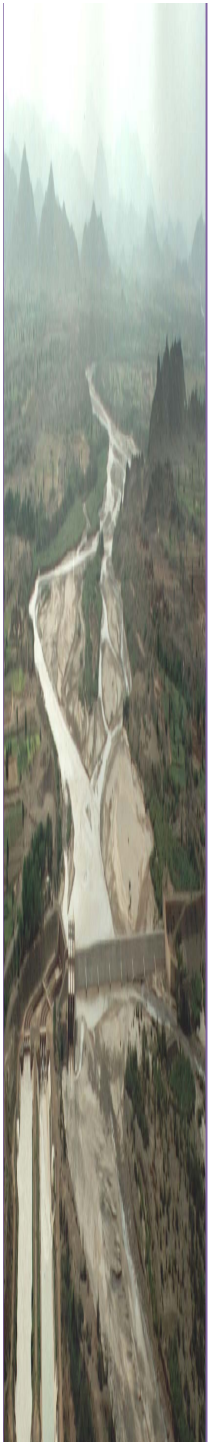

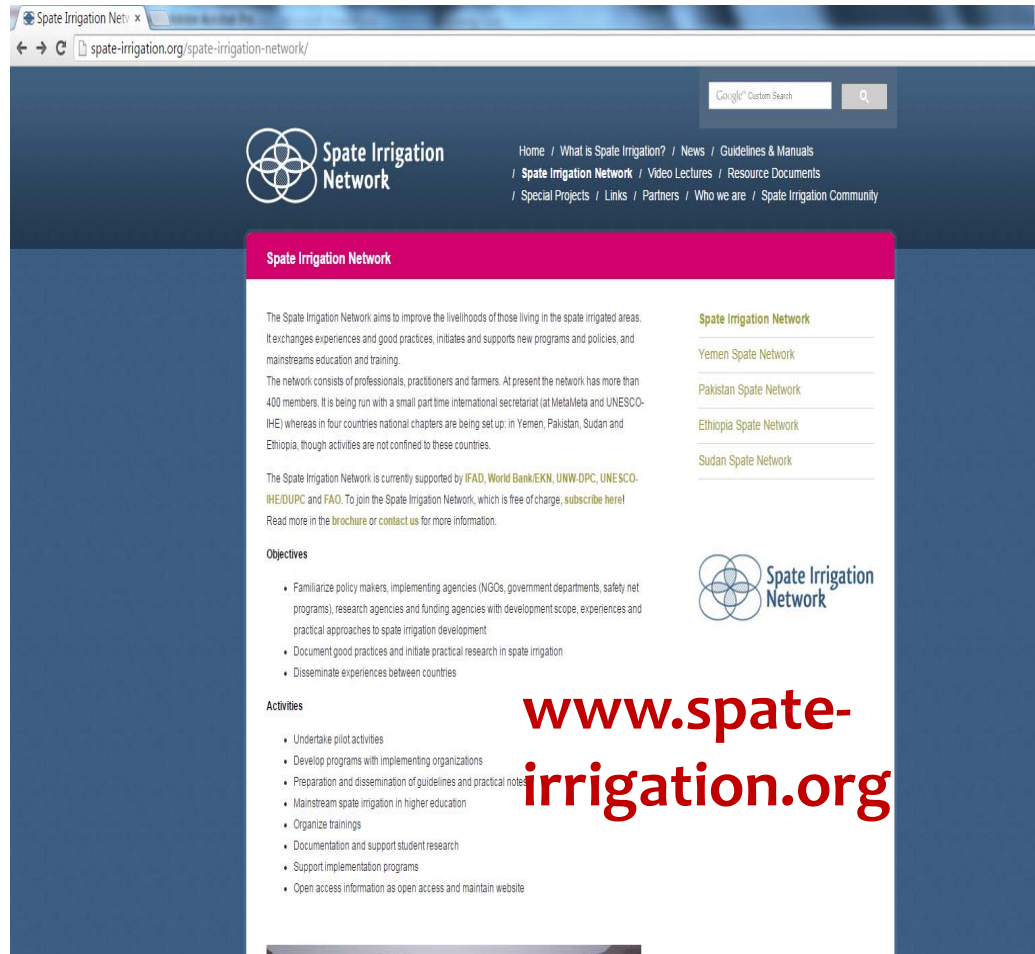

2 The need to transform

- If high impact on the ground is to be achieved, strengthening partnership with farmers becomes mandatory:
 - Rich indigenous knowledge;
 - Better communication and understanding among themselves;
 - Practical solutions to their problems;
 - Two way traffic better than one way;
 - Transforming the network to include farmers, researchers, policy makers, practitioners is vital.

Phase 4: 2015 ... The Journey Ahead – new frontier with our partners

In the existing network, a transformation will be made toward network of farmers/agropastoralists and their organisations, so as to create a broader grass root movement and direct implementation capacity.

Phase 4: 2015 to 2020

The Challenge

Transform the current network into a farmer owned FBF Network

Active engagement of farmers

Co-conduct solution oriented action research

The Approach

Include core team of farmers into country network

Develop mechanisms for effective engagement

Capacity building: Farmer Learning Centres established

Co-develop scientifically sound and practically relevant research proposals

The Overarching approach

Working in partnership with varied stakeholders (including farmers, researchers, policy makers, practitioners, etc)

4 What promising activities do we have to support this?

The case of Ethiopia

- Database of WUAs and contact information under compilation
- Approaches for effective engagement of farmers under preparation
- Cross-country farmer to farmer field based knowledge and experience sharing program scheduled for 16 – 19 May 2016
- Tailor-made training to selected farmers from one of the potential FBFS areas (Raya Valley) will be organized during 14 – 15 May 2016
 - In preparation for the experience sharing event;
 - Suggestions on training themes most welcome.
- “Community Learning, Research and Innovation Centre” under establishment in Raya Valley
- Internship program of young professionals - will work on consolidating Phase 4 objectives
